Wallace et al., (2003) conducted a pre-experimental study on substance abuse and ill effect on adolescents and study reveals that it is important also to keep inter-racial variations in drug and alcohol use in mind when comparing the prevalence of substance use with that of other races. For instance, the findings from the 1985-1989 Monitoring the Future surveys that show that American Indian and white male binge drinking rates were identical would seem encouraging until one considers that both groups were twice as likely as African. American males and 2.5 times more likely than Asian-American males to have consumed 5 or more drinks in one setting in the 2 weeks prior to the survey. In other words, it isn't necessarily a good thing that American Indian adolescents' drug and alcohol use patterns approach those of white adolescents because those white adolescents also

Chatterjee, (2019) However, there is some proof that reception of medication-assisted treatments influences treatment duration among youths. Researchers examining a sample of more than 4,500 youths ages 13 to 22 found that youths who received opioid use disorder medication (e.g., buprenorphine, naltrexone) within 3 months of diagnosis with an opioid use disorder stayed in treatment longer than those who did not receive the medication (150 days of treatment, compared with 67 days of treatment).

Drake, (2012) The author examines youth substance use treatment programs aim to reduce alcohol and illicit drug use, and the misuse of licit drugs, in youths who have been clinically diagnosed with a substance use problem. These programs differ from prevention programs, which aim to promote abstinence in youths to prevent their initial or escalating use. Treatment programs can take a multitude of approaches, such as court-based, residential-based, and family-inclusive programs to help youth develop skills and knowledge to reduce substance use.

Issues and Challenges:
